

building has been slow. The Senate has been mired down in filibusters that surround redrawing the state's congressional district maps. At the root of the debates is a growing divide between members of the Republican Conservative Caucus and other Republican Caucus members. Also, with this year being an election year and several members seeking other offices, the divide between the two groups has only intensified. As a result, House Floor Leader Dean Plocher (R-St. Louis) has had to prioritize bills sent to the Senate Chamber and keep many bills that have already been perfected in the House on the "Third Read" calendar until the deadlock in the Senate is broken. Rules of the legislature require the Senate to take bills up in the order they are received from the House.
