

Finalized Opioid Settlement Announced

Missouri Attorney General Eric Schmitt announced on February 18 that his Office has finalized a historic opioid settlement with Johnson

and AmerisourceBergen). These settlements bring a total of roughly \$458 million to Missouri; this is one of the largest victim-centric settlements in the history of the State. There is the potential for additional money received through other litigation with Mallinckrodt and Purdue Pharma, more will be known about the amounts as the cases continue forward. The Johnson & Johnson and other distributors' settlement brings in an estimated \$458 million, with approximately \$274,800.00 going to the State and \$183,200.00 going to localities.

Southeast Asia evergreen tree. HB1667 creates regulatory guidelines to protect Missourians from altered or contaminated Kratom. discussing redistricting congressional maps again this week. At the federal level, MCRSP is actively engaged with a national coalition aimed at increasing the substance abuse prevention and treatment block grant to the states in the fiscal year (FY) 2022 budget. The block grant has remained stagnant for the past 14 years at \$1.8 billion. The Biden Administration had proposed to fund the block grant at \$3.5 billion. The U.S. House of Representatives approved a \$1 billion increase last year and the Senate Democrats had proposed a figure in between the House version and the Administration's proposal. Most notably, all of the parties agreed that if there is an increase, the block grant should also have a 10% setaside for recovery programs. The 2022 federal fiscal year already began on October 1, 2021, but

due to gridlock in the U.S. Congress, a complete budget package has not been agreed on by

continuing resolutions (CRs), that keep the government running at the previous fiscal year's budget levels. The current CR is set to expire March 11. It is widely believed that Congress will reach a budget agreement by that deadline. Heavy negotiations have been ongoing amongst the

Congress and the Administration. As a result, the government has been operating on

leadership of both Chambers of Congress. So, we should know the FY2022 budget figures before the end of the week. It seems clear that there will be an increase in the block grant, as well as the State Opioid Response (SOR) grant program and the Building Communities of Recovery (BCOR) grant program, but the exact amount of the increase is unknown. Also, it appears likely there will be a set-aside for recovery, but the percentage remains unknown. It could be 10%, but could also be 9%, 8%.... We should know by the end of the week. That being said, we are already 6 months into the 2022 fiscal year. Congress is already starting work on the FY20223 budget, which will begin on October 1 of this year. There is also legislation pending that would make the 10% recovery set-aside in the block grant permanent. So, a lot of work remains at the federal level. Stay tuned. If I had to predict, I would expect to hear some really good news in the next few days. **Upcoming Events**
